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Cathedral Arts Project ARTS Ignite! classes begin for 2017-2018

September 19, 2017 — After a week's delay due to Hurricane Irma, the Cathedral Arts Project's ARTS Ignite! afterschool classes began this week at 19 Duval County Public Schools and community centers throughout Jacksonville.

During the 2016-2017 school year, CAP provided programming to 1,033 students, due in part to a \$50,000 grant from the Hearst Foundations.

- 94% demonstrate the skills needed to produce quality art or performance
- 87% increase active participation in the classroom
- 88% strengthen their task completion
- 88% demonstrate improved communication skills
- 82% learn more effective strategies for expressing anger and resolving conflict

The Hearst Foundations support well-established nonprofit organizations that address significant issues within the areas of culture, education, health and social service. In each area of funding, the Foundations also look for evidence of sustainability beyond their support, and among cultural organizations, preference is given to arts education programs that effectively fill the void of arts programming in K-12 curricula.
