December 2, 2016 – The Cathedral Arts Project (CAP) is pleased to announce that Ron Shreve will be leaving his position as Program Coordinator at CAP and joining the Theatre Jacksonville team as Education Director, effective December 30, 2016.

Ron has been an invaluable asset to the CAP team in his short time here, but his transition back to Theatre Jacksonville is not only the right move for him personally, but also for the Jacksonville arts community.

"Ron is an intelligent, compassionate, talented and hardworking educator and administrator," said Allison Galloway-Gonzalez, Chief Program Officer and Any Given Child (AGC) Executive Director.
