 - **Program Development:** Contribute to the growth of CAP's therapeutic services by developing new programs, mentoring colleagues and sharing expertise about working with students with disabilities. Collaboration with teachers and site directors including goal setting and data meetings are an integral part of the position.
 - **Community Connection:** Occasionally participate in workshops or community arts events, which strengthen the bond between CAP and the wider community. These activities highlight the role the arts play in fostering community engagement and cultural appreciation.
